Suicide Alertness Training at Longs Peak UMC Instructor: Robyn Morgan

Saturday, October 29th from 9 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

Almost all of us have, or will have, someone in our lives who could be at risk for suicide. It could be a friend, family member, neighbor, or colleague.

- How do you know if someone is having thoughts of suicide?
- What should you say or not say?
- Where can you find help?

You could help save the life of someone you know or love by attending Safe TALK (Suicide Alertness for Everyone).

Pre-registration is required because space is limited:

Participants must be at least 15 years old to attend. Youth participants (ages 15-17) must have a signed permission form available upon registering.
