Letter from the SAS Discernment Team:

Dear Church Family,

As you may be aware, over the past year, the LPUMC Church Council has been exploring the relevancy of moving toward a Simplified Accountability Structure, hereafter referred to as SAS. The Church Council, in its ongoing deliberations, has recommended the flowing motivations and reasons why this will work for a potential structure change:

- The opportunity to involve more people at a missiona level.
- Improve efficiency,
- Streamline the decision-making process.

The Church Council was given permission by our DS (District Superintendent) to move forward with this exploration process. To this end, it is important to get your feedback. We will be having several small group informational meetings during April and May and an opportunity to attend a meeting after church June 4th in the event you were unable to attend a small group. We hope you make time to attend one of these meetings. At the meeting you will here more details about the plan and how it would affect our church family. Your questions and opinions are important during this discernment process.

Based on congregational feedback, leadership discernment and DS approval (or not), the goal is to be able to vote on approving, or not approving, the SAS model at the Church Conference in July 2023.

There is also an SAS prayer Team in place to help keep the focus on the missional aspect of the church. Prayers will be lifted asking for guidance and clarity on the model and the timing. (cont. on next page)

We are also seeking God's guidance in providing wisdom and clarity if this model will help the church be more faithful and effective in its mission of making disciples.
