Pastor's Pen:

For I hold you by your right hand— I, the LORD your God. And I say to you, "Don't be afraid. I am here to help you." Isaiah 41:13

Perhaps there is nothing more reassuring than that of physical touch. When Peter attempts to walk on the water and begins to panic, sinking below the waves- it's Jesus's hand that that restores his faith. When we are afraid, the offer of another's hand gives us the same encouragement. The theme of this year's Mountain Sky Annual Conference was *Give Me Your Hand*, as an invitation for United Methodists to engage deeply in care for one another.

The past few years the church has known its share of fears. Fears around societal changes as we rebound from COVID, and realize that the church does not look quite like it used to. Fears that we are not regularly receiving new members or young families. Fears around the discussion regarding the possible ordination of LGBTQ+ clergy and the possible sanctioning of same sex marriages. Fears over the future of a fractured UMC denomination.

Last week the *Times- Call* ran a front-page article relating that thirty-eight churches in the Mountain Sky Conference (32 are from Colorado) have chosen to dissolve their connection to the United Methodist Church citing "reasons related to human sexuality." With the sole exception of Brighton UMC on the front range, these were small town rural churches from the southeastern corner of the state. To leave the UMC, these churches were required to pass a 2/3 church vote, pay fees for the release from the conference trust clause, pay clergy pension and mission shares, and remove all United Methodist symbols from their buildings. It was with the utmost grace, respect and grief that this work was approved by delegates of the annual conference. To see such news in the headlines is certainly another source of fear, and as painful as this was to navigate, let me give you a snapshot of where we are as the Mountain Sky Conference today.

In 2019 there were 376 churches in our conference, after this past weekend there are now 318 churches or 84%. This number also reflects church closures, in addition to new church starts. In 2019 there were 60,796 professing United Methodists, today there are 48,068, or 79%. This decline was not only around differences in theology, but also reflects those who quit attending church during the pandemic and have never returned. In 2023 70% of Mountain Sky churches worship less than 85 in-person attendees on Sunday morning. Those are certainly some fearful statistics! LPUMC's post-COVID is 159 in person and 80 online, or 239 on a given Sunday! This is a testament to your welcoming nature as the church!

Now let me offer you my hand, with a hopeful statistic. In 2019 on an average Sunday in our conference there were 32,339 people in worship, today the average any given Sunday is 34,422 worshipers, that's a 106% from 2019! Where are all these people? Many are online. Online worship has become the new "back-row" for new visitors! So, while we might be tempted to lament where we are, the numbers show that our words, our actions, our love, and our inclusion are a witness to the life changing gospel of Jesus Christ. There is hope!

And as a reminder for those of you who were not able to attend the information session about disaffiliation held at our church in March, the General Conference of the United Methodist Church will take place in North Carolina in April of 2024. At that time, delegates from UMC's all over the world will meet to determine if there will be changes to the Book of Discipline that would impact local churches. Until that is determined, we won't know if it is even necessary to take a vote regarding the sexuality issues at the local level. I mention this because there are some who have asked when we will be voting and the answer is not until after April, if at all.

Speaking of voting... IMPORTANT NOTICE...Coming up later this month will be an all church vote on adopting the *Simplified Accountability Structure.* This in no way has anything to with disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church! The SAS vote is a proposal to free up our church members from an unwieldly committee structures and move us towards being a more missionally focused church by reducing the number of our administrative committees to one that encompasses more areas. Anyone on our roll as a member will be able to vote.

Give me your hand, if you are feeling anxious or have question about any of these issues or trends, let's talk. I am always up for a cup of coffee with friends, it is a blessing to journey with you as your pastor.

Based on congregant feedback and leadership discernment, the Church Council, at its June 21st meeting, unanimously approved requesting to the DS to move to the SAS through a congregational vote tentatively scheduled for July 23rd following the church service. Pending the outcome of the vote, the Nominating Committee will begin its task of identifying persons to serve on the Leadership Board beginning January 1, 2024.

Many thanks to the Discernment Team, Mary Jane Mees, Carol Monhollen, Jean Werner, Bruce Richardson, Roger Wisehart and Joe Pieper for their dedication and commitment to successfully completing the first step of the process through being the hands and feet of Christ. Approximately 90-100 church members were informed of the SAS process followed by an opportunity to ask questions about the new structure.

Housed next to the United Church of Christ on Collyer St, Hopelight Medical Clinic provides low cost medical care, lab services, pharmacy, behavioral health services and counseling to the uninsured and underinsured members of our community. In-kind donations have dropped considerably since before COVID, so we would like to collect some much-needed items: Over the counter allergy medicine, Saline nasal spray, Neti Pots and Neil-Med Sinus Rinses, Cough drops, Pill boxes, Children's and Adult's ibuprofen (Advil) and acetaminophen (Tylenol), Compression stockings for men and women, & Portable Automatic Blood Pressure Cuffs.
